HONEYMOON: MUTUAL DISCOVERY



- Enthusiasm and idealistic expectations.
- Excitement with fellow group members
- Volunteer, compromise, and avoid conflicts.
- Thrilled by a sense of togetherness.
- Probable gap between ideal perceived reality and the actual reality.





INCUBATION: GROWING TOGETHER



- Search for one's individual unique place in the group.
- Mutual care and support amongst members are tested.
- Forming authentic connections and transforming into a cohesive group.
- Members decide on their commitment to the group should I stay or should I go.



- Harder (than before) to settle on personal priorities and
 - abilities for the sake of others and idyllic dynamics.







EVOLUTION: SHARED IDENTITY



- Positive experience overcoming a conflict, united.
- Individuals recognize their value in the group based on
 - their strengths and assets.
- formed.
- Increased intimacy and deeper connections. Shifting focus from individuals to the group.
